PERSONAL HYGIENE POLICY

Personal Hygiene:

- Staff must maintain high levels of personal hygiene; this includes showering regularly and keeping hair washed and neat.
- Clean clothes must be worn to work daily.
- For hygiene reasons nails should be kept short, clean and varnish free. False nails are not permitted to be worn to work.
- All cuts/ sores/ boils must be covered with a blue-water proof plaster. This is to protect you from acquiring an infection as well as to protect the Service User from acquiring an infection.
- Wear sensible footwear which enclose the toe and heel e.g. no flip-flops, sandals, crocs etc.

Washing Hands:

Hands are washed regularly throughout the day and especially after:

- · Going to the toilet.
- · Assisting with toileting.
- Handling rubbish.
- Tea breaks.
- Handling money.
- Before serving food.
- Coughing, sneezing, touching face/hair/nose/mouth Handling cleaning chemicals.

Hands are washed as per the instructions on the Hand Hygiene Module:

The key points in the hand washing process are:

- 1. Remove all jewellery.
- 2. Sleeves pushed up.
- 3. Hot water applied to the hands.
- 4. Soap dispensed onto the hands and warm water added.
- 5. All parts of the hands & wrists washed as per the instructions in the Hand Hygiene module on hseland.ie.
- 6. Hands must be rinsed thoroughly to remove all traces of soap and dried properly to avoid irritation

Antibacterial gel should be applied to dry hands immediately after washing.

Disposable gloves

- The use of disposable gloves shall not be substituted for hand washing by workers.
- Disposable gloves shall only be worn for short periods and changed frequently.

• Hands shall be washed where necessary, after using disposable gloves.

<u>Under no circumstances should disposable gloves be used on different Service Users or be transferred from location to location.</u>

Where disposable gloves are used they are discarded following:

- Cleaning duties.
- Handling refuse.
- Handling or preparing raw food.
- Continence duties.

Gloves are also discarded if they:

- Are ripped, torn.
- Become loose due to over wearing.
